Notes

1. The Template does not include reference to a 'table' as distinct from the altar. There are many occasions on which the altar is used when the Eucharist is not being celebrated eg Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament; Holy Communion on Good Friday. It is acceptable that the Altar be used when the ciborium is brought from the tabernacle.
2. The leader of the LWWHC should go to a suitable chair, not the priest's chair, as a way of distinguishing the LWWHC from the Eucharist.
3. Ministers of the LWWHC will observe the requirements of the liturgical seasons, such as the presence or absence of the Gloria

Leader: Jesus, Sun of Justice, you bring together the scattered flock of God. Lord, have mercy.

Penitential Rite

Leader: Gathered together in Christ, let us ask forgiveness with confidence, for God is full of gentleness and compassion.

After a brief silence, all pray together.

All: I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Leader: May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.

Glory To God

All: Glory to God in the highest,
and on earth peace to people of good will.
We praise you, we bless you,
we adore you, we glorify you,
we give you thanks for your great glory,
Lord God, heavenly King,
O God, almighty Father.
Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son,
Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father,
you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us;
you take away the sins of the world,
receive our prayer;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father,
have mercy on us.
For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,

Opening Prayer

Leader: Let us pray . . .

After a pause for silent prayer, the Collect of the day is said.

All: Amen.

Invitation to Communion

Leader: Behold the Lamb of God,
behold him who takes away the sins of the world.
Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

**All: Lord, I am not worthy that you should
enter under my roof, but only say the word
and my soul shall be healed.**

Communion

The distribution of Holy Communion takes place in the usual way.

Communion Hymn

A period of silence is observed after Communion.

Prayer after Communion

Collection

Leader: Let us pray . . .

God of blessings, we have been fed at this table
with the bread of heaven. Give us this food always,
that it may strengthen your love in our hearts and
inspire us to serve you in our brothers and sisters.
Grant this in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord.

All: Amen

Leader: We now come to the distribution of Holy Communion.

COMMUNION RITE

Leader: At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Sign of Peace

Leader: Let us seal our prayer with a gesture of unity and reconciliation as we offer one another a sign of peace.

The sign of peace is exchanged in the usual manner.

PLEASE KNEEL as the Blessed Sacrament is brought from the Tabernacle to the altar.

Reflection

Profession of Faith

Leader: In union with the whole Church, let us profess our faith.

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, **(all bow) who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary,** suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Proclamation of Praise (*Ephesians 3:1-14 adapted*)

Leader: Let us praise the Lord.

Blessed are you,
God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

with every spiritual blessing of heaven.

to be holy and blameless before you.
